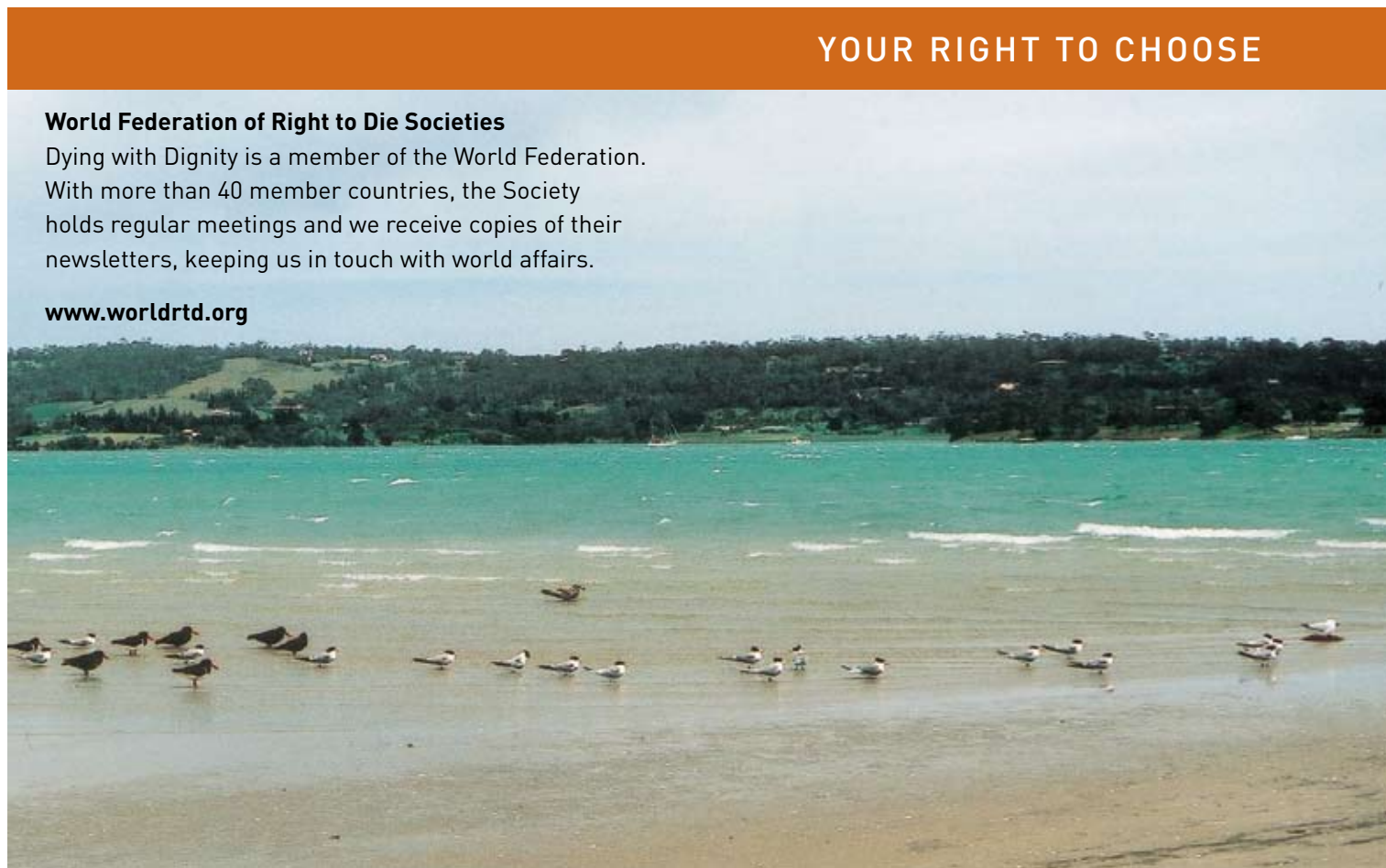

In the same way that Wills and Powers of Attorney are made as a matter of course, we strongly recommend that an Enduring Guardianship be made. Thus, in the unfortunate event of persons not being able to speak for themselves, their legal representatives can speak for them to carry out their wishes. This may assist medical staff when treating persons who have registered this Guardianship.

There may come a time in our lives when severe pain, suffering and distress caused by illness or disability cannot be alleviated or remedied.

In response to a 2007 Newspoll survey, 75-80% of Australians believed that in such circumstances a person should be entitled by law to a painless and dignified death at a time of their own choosing, in accordance with their expressed wishes.

In Tasmania, **Dying with Dignity's** aim is to advocate and promote legislation which would give people the right to choose and which would include safeguards to prevent abuse.

Dying with Dignity is a not-for-profit organisation which conducts information and education programmes to create an environment more favourable to achieving definitive legislation.

Issues surrounding aspects of palliative care and of voluntary euthanasia are discussed in a tranquil manner to provide a informative foundation for decision-making.
